



Hôpital Sacré Coeur C R U D E M



In 1999 the Holy Father designated CRUDEM as one of his 100 projects for the Year of Charity.

The CRUDEM Foundation, directed by Knights and Dames from the American, Federal, and Western Associations, provides a superb hospital, Hôpital Sacré Coeur, that serves the people of Northern Haiti, regardless of their religion, economic status, or disease with a competent Haitian medical staff of 12 full-time and 3 part-time physicians, one dentist and 35 nurses is augmented by 170 volunteers from out of the country who travel to Milot at their own expense each year to provide specialty services. Two Daughters of Charity live and work at the hospital, adding further expertise plus a meaningful religious presence.

Hôpital Sacré Coeur, located in Milot, a village in Northern Haiti, is the only hospital in the region. It has

64 beds, a pediatric wing, an outpatient clinic, maternity services, and a laboratory. Last year the hospital staff served 36,000 outpatients and 2,900 inpatients, delivered 581 babies and performed 1,149 surgical procedures.

The hospital plans to expand the Mobile Clinic initiated in October 2003 to better serve the needs of the 225,000 people living within a twelve-mile radius of Milot in smaller hamlets and rural communities.

The Nutrition Center provides two free meals daily to about 40 mal-nourished preschool children. CRUDEM also supports the primary school education of 1,000 children in four Catholic schools in the Milot region.
